BE THERE

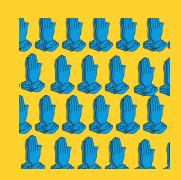

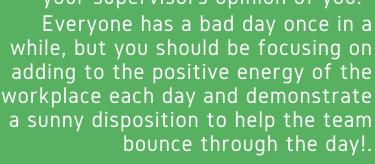

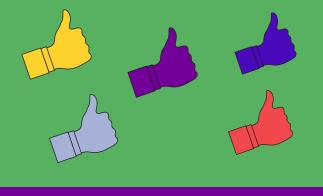
